In the name of God amen I Thomas Sculbeck of North
Hampton Parish in the County of Richmond by old age and Course of Years
find weakness in Constitution and knowing that is appointed for all men
Once to die do make and confirm this to be my Last will and Testament
In presence Principally and first of all In presence my soul with the
hands of God that gave it and my Body I commit to the Earth to be buried

In Christian like and devout manner at the Devotion of my Executors
hereafter named and such such worldly Estate whereunto God has blessed
me both I give and Bequeath of the same in the following Manner & form
First my will and desire is that my loving wife Ann Sewall shall
have the use of my whole Estate both Real and Personal for and during
the term of her natural life without interruption. And my will is that
after the decease of my wife Ann Sewall before mentioned that my Plantation
with all Appurtenances and Privileges therunto belonging shall be to
and for the use and Property of my son Alexander Sewall and the heirs
of his Body lawfully begotten but in default of such issue to fall to my son
Miles Sewall and his heirs. And I give to my Daughter Mary Gordon
one feather bed and furniture to it in full of her full portion debarring her
from any other part of my Estate either Real or Personal.
And I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Briggs one Dresser
And I give to my grandson Joshua Sewall and his sister Sarah
Sewall the Children of William Sewall my son each of them one Shillings
Naturally debarring them from any share in the same.

Remit the Children of William Sumbloch my son Each of them one Shilling
Intirely debarring them from any Claim or title hereafter to any part of my
Estate Real or Personal. *Witness* I give to my son James Sumbloch &
Children Each of them one Shilling in full to debar them from any other
Part of my Estate Either Real or Personal. *Witness* My will and
Desire is that after the decease of my wife that my whole Estate be Equally
divided Except Legacies Between my four Children namely Alexander
Sumbloch, Thomas Sumbloch, ^{John} ~~William~~ Sumbloch and Elizabeth Groggs.
Witness I do acknowledge and Confirm my loving wife Anne Sumbloch whole &
sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament Intirely revoking all
former wills by me made Ratifying and confirming this to be my last will
and testimony whereof I have hereunto put my hand and put my seal this
5th day of February 1756 *Thomas Sumbloch*

to him by virtue of this Will not to be recovered by his Children or any other
Person for testimony whereof I have hereunto put my hand this day and year
when made and his part if not appearing to be decided between the other
