in manner and form following—

I give and bequeath my soul to God who gave it first to me and my body to be buried
in a Christian like manner as my Executors hereafter mentioned shall think fit
ing and my worldly goods as followeth First—

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Ruth South one best Bed and furniture
and one Iron Pot and hooks Item I give and bequeath to my son Daniel Everett
all my wearing cloaths and working Tools Gun and case of Pistols and half my
Land whereon I now live and the Remainder part at the Decease of my loving
wife Margaret Everett to him and his Heirs for ever Item I lend to my loving
wife Margaret Everett the use of all my Estate Real and Personal untill Christ
mas come twelve months and then a Division of my Negroes and my loving
wife to have my negro man Tom and his wife winney During her natural

wife to have my negro man Tom and his wife Winney During her natural
Life and at her Decease to return to my Children as shall be hereafter mentioned
Item I give and bequeath to my son Daniel Everett one Negro woman
named Dianna and one Negro boy named Isaac only to pay the pounds
more than the rest of my Children to the Estate to pay the Debts then the
said Negroes to him and his Heirs for ever Item I lend to my Daugh-
ter Ann Hammond two Negroes namely Leticia and Adam during her
natural Life and at her Decease to be Equally Divided amongst her Chil-
dren Item I lend to my Daughter Elizabeth Williams two negroes namely
Sarah and Anthony during her life and at her Decease to be Equally divided
amongst her Children Item I lend to my Daughter Sarah Dodson two neg-
roes namely Mollie and Simon during her life and at her Decease to be
Equally Divided amongst her Children Item I lend to my Daughter Ruth
Routh two Negroes namely Charles & Winney during her life and then to be
Equally Divided amongst her Lawfull Heirs Item it is my Desire that
the said Division be made following after the Negroes are Divided which

amongst her Children. Item I lend to my Daughter Sarah Dodson two negro
serves namely Mollin and Simon during her life and at her Decease to be
Equally Divided amongst her Children. Item I lend to my Daughter Ruth
Routh two Negroes namely Charles & Winney during her life and then to be
Equally Divided amongst her Lawfull Heirs. Item it is my Desire that
my Stock be Divided the way following after the Negroes are Divided which
is Cattle and Sheep of which my Loving wife is to have one half and the other
Part to be Equally Divided between my two Daughters Elizabeth Williams
and Sarah Dodson. Item it is my will if the Estate be in Debt at the
Division they may sell my Black horse and my new feather Bed to discharge
the same and if that shall not do, to pay an Equal part in proportion amongst
them all. Item I give and Bequeath to my Loving wife Margaret Everett
the use of my whole estate which hath not been bequeathed During her natural
life or widowhood and at her Decease or Marriage to be Equally Divided
amongst all my Children.

I am Appoint my loving wife and my son Daniel Everett whole &
Sole Executors of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof
I have set my hand and Seal this eighteenth day of February 1759
