of in the manner following

Item I give and bequeath to my son Griffin Garland one Negro Man named
Peter one Negro Girl named Kate after the death of his mother to him & his heirs
Item I give and bequeath to my son William Garland all my lands in the fork
of Totuskey a small Mill worn & tub, one bow and ball that I have already given
him one Negro woman by the name of Hannah and all her future increase after
his mother's death to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Valentine Garland one Negro Boy Daniel
one Negro Girl named Jenn after his mother's death to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Garland one Negro man named
Isaac one Negro Girl named Jane after her mother's death to her & her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Anne Garland one Negro Girl named
Catherine

one Negro Girl named Jean after his mothers death to him and his heirs forever
them I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Garland one Negro man named
Isaac one Negro Girl named Simon after her Mothers death to her & her heirs forever
them I give and bequeath to my Daughter Anne Garland one Negro Girl named
Grace one Negro Girl named Patt after her mothers death to her & her heirs forever
them my will and desire is that my Negro Woman named Patt be bound to
live with which of my children she pleases after her Mistress death
And for the rest of my estate both real and personal I give and bequeath to my loving
wife Anne Garland together with what I have already given to my children as above
to her during her life and after her decease the personal Estate to be Equally divided
amongst my children lastly I constitute and appoint my wife Anne Garland Son
and my Son William Garland Executor of this my last will and Testament and I
disannul all wills or bequeaths by me heretofore as utterly void declaring this and
no other to be my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my seal the day and year above written
