My Will. I have to day my said Will and Testament touching and concerning all
My Estate Will before by me made. Being at this importune time and
Memory thanks be to the Almighty God for it

I beseeche you to commit my soul into the hands of the Almighty God my maker
hoping to be saved by the merit of Jesus Christ my redeemer and my
body to the earth to have a decent and Christian burial and as for my
Worldly estate I do dispose of them in manner and form as followeth

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son John Griffin or his heirs the plantation
whereon I do now live with all the goods belonging to it for ever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son William Griffin or his heirs for ever
the plantation whereon Henry I do now live with all the goods
belonging to it.

Item: I gave a one of my two Sons when before they come to the age of
Twenty three years his part to fall to my son Charles Griffin and his
heirs for ever and in case that both my Sons John and William
die before they come to age then my son Joseph to have one of the
plantation to him and his heirs for ever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my young wife Ann Griffin my mill
and the goods belonging to it to sell and dispose of as she pleases her

belonging to it.

Item - If also a one of my two Sons Dies before they come to the age of
16 years I would have him his part to fall to my Son Charles Griffin and his
heirs for ever and in equal parts between my Sons John and William
Dies before they come to age then my Son Joseph to have one of the
plantations to him and his heirs for ever

Item - I Give and bequeath to my young wife Ann Griffin my Mill &
all the said land belonging to it to sell or dispose of as she pleases her
selfe with the rest of my property in like manner and will her self
to give equally Dowered between my young wife and my Children
all in generall.

Item - I do appial and constitute my said wife and my son John
Griffin my Executrix and her to sell my said Mill and Condemned
Building my Land and Seal this 2 day of March 1724

In the Name of God Amen I make my last Will and Testament after this
will - all Wells of parish of Hornbeam in the County of Richmond being sick
and weak of body but of sound and perfect memory made this
11th day of January in the year of our Lord 1677 and Anno Regni Greate
Charles the Second King of England Scotland and Ireland
I hope to have part in the Resurrection of the just after my Body Cometh
to the Earth to be decently buried without the Vicinity of London or any
Exe. Crosses or Hamlets and convenient and near for my Body Goods
I give to followeth my first Table being first paid to Anne Richardson my
Elizabeth Wells Thomas Williams Wells I leave him to Richard of whom
whilst he age of twenty one and a half years old his freedom one side of
apparel Abraham Wells I give to him say Gray paseu Marke to Sarah
Sisson I give a good saddle to Francis Sullen my son I give her a good
young mare to be paid to him at age the other side I give to my
son Stephen Wells a young mare a shoot a colt and a foal belonging
to him to my friends the tenth Day of February 1677
