Will. I this to be my last Will and Testament Revoking and disannulling all
former Wills before by me made I being at this ^{time} in perfect sense and
memory thanks be to the Almighty God for it.

I Impet I Commit my soul into the hands of the Almighty God my maker
hoping to be saved by the merits of Jesus Christ my Redeemer and my
Body to the Earth to have a Decent and Christian Burial and as for my
Worldly Estate I do dispose of them in manner and form as followeth.

I Impet I Give and bequeath unto my Son John Griffin or his heirs the plantation
whereon I do now live with all the lands belonging to it for ever.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son William Griffin or his heirs for ever
the plantation whereon Henry I. now all do live with all the lands
belonging to it.

Item If one or one of my two Sons Dies before they come to the age of
Twenty I would then his part to fall to my Son Charles Griffin and his
heirs for ever and in Case that both my Sons John and William
Dies before they come to age then my Son Joseph to have one of the
plantations to him and his heirs for ever.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my young Wife Ann Griffin my Will
and the lands belonging to it to sell or dispose of as she pleases her

belonging to it.

Item - If any one of my two Sons Dies before they come to the age of Twenty I would then his part to fall to my Son Charles Griffin and his heirs for ever and in Case that both my Sons John and William Dies before they come to age then my Son Joseph to have one of the plantations to him and his heirs for ever.

Item - I Give and bequeath unto my Loving Wife Ann Griffin my Mill and the Land belonging to it to sell or dispose of as she pleases for selfe and all the rest of my worldly estate. I bequeath and all the rest to be equally divided between my Loving Wife and my Children all in generall.

Item - I Do appoint and constitute my Loving Wife and my Son John Griffin my Execut^r and Adm^r of this my last Will and Testament as Witness my hand and Seale this 2 Day of March 1724
