In the Name of God, Amen I Abraham Eller of the County of Remick and State of Virginia, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, I do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows. First I do direct that my Executor hereinafter named shall out of my Estate as soon after my death as may be convenient pay all my just debts, funeral Expenses &c.

Second, I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Polly Eller One Thousand Dollars in cash to be paid her so soon as convenient, and also the following property, Namely, One cow two or three beds and bedding cook stove and chairs one bureau one chest one cupboard one safe, candlestick one clock, all to be selected by herself, and such Kitchen and table furniture as will enable her to keep house comfortably

And I further direct that my Executor hereinafter named, shall after giving reasonable notice sell to the highest bidder my farm containing Two Hundred acres more or less and all my Personal property that I may have left after my decease at such payments as may be thought best and when the last payment is made then my Executor shall make a good and lawful deed to the above mentioned land & farm.

Then I will that all the moneys received from my said Personal Estate Bonds or money in hand shall be equally divided between all my children share and share alike.

Namely Anna Magdalena John B. Eliza Sarah Abraham Francis A. Nancy Catherine & Manda J.

I do further reserve one half acre of land at the graveyard that shall not be sold shall be for the benefit of a Neighbourhood graveyard and I do appoint John B. Haff to be my Executor to make sale collect and pay off as above directed and hereby revoking all other wills by me made.
