(p 35); 13rd I give to my brother William Smith if he be alive at my death, if however my said brother William, shall not be alive at my death, then I desire that this bequest be equally divided between my residuary legatees, viz: my brothers, Absalom & John Smith three hundred dollars, (\$300); 13th I desire that my Executor proceed to sell all my estate (after my death) both real and personal, including the lands, negroes, and personal estate will be to one by my late husband Joshua Burnett, and pay off all the foregoing cash Legacies, and all other just claims against me, the expenses of executing this will &c the remaining portions of my estate I give to my brothers John and Absalom Smith to be equally divided between them; 14th It is my will and desire that if my brothers John and Absalom can so arrange to have the cash Legacies paid by the sale of my other property or otherwise that they purchase the negroes, themselves, as I desire that they shall not go out of the family; 15th Whereas, it is uncertain whether that portion of the land on which I reside, containing the grave yard, where I wish to be buried, and where lie the remains of my late husband Joshua Burnett, will fall to my share in the division under my late husband's will, I desire if it does, not fall to my lot, that my Executor, purchase a title to said grave yard of the owner or owners, and have the same deeded in trust to my brothers John & Absalom Smith to be held sacred forever as a grave yard, If it does fall to my lot, I leave the said grave yard in trust to my aforesaid brothers, for the uses of a grave yard forever. Lastly I do hereby revoke all other will or wills by me made & declare this to be my last will & testament, and hereby constitute and appoint my friend Colvin Bap Executor of the same, witness my signature and seal this seventh day September one thousand eight hundred and fifty four

At Roanoke December Court 1854 The last will and testament of Sarah Burnett *test.* was this day produced in Court, together with a Codicil thereto attached, and the said will was partly proved by the oath of Jacob Leonard a subscribing witness thereto, and continued for further proof, the said Codicil was also proved by the oaths of Jacob Leonard and Joseph Leonard, subscribing witnesses, thereto, and also continued for further proof as to the will, And at Roanoke January Court 1853, the said last will and testament of Sarah Burnett deceased, with a codicil, thereto attached, was again produced in Court and the said will and codicil were further proved by the oath of William M. Hugue a subscribing witness thereto, and ordered to be recorded

An A. Branch: I Ann A. Branch of the County of Roanoke and State of Virginia, do make publick and declare this writing to be my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time made, and first I direct that my body be decently interred and that my funeral be conducted in a manner corresponding with my estate and situation in life, and as to such worldly estate as it has

please, God to entrust me with I dispose of the same as follows: First, I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my decease, as possible out of the first money that shall come into the hands of my executors; I give to Laura A. Reed wife of Albert G. Reed my gold watch my gold spectacles, plate, and other jewelry I further give to the said Laura A. Reed the following slaves, to wit, Stephen Amanda, Maria, Francis, Rachel, old Tom, and Frank and here increased to be delivered to the said Laura A. Reed immediately after my decease to be owned held and disposed of by her as she may think proper; I hereby direct that all the money that may be due me at my decease arising from the hire of my negroes, or that due by bond or otherwise shall be collected immediately by my executors and that he purchase a gold watch worth one hundred dollars, and said watch be presented to Agent N. Reed, and the remainder of said money if there should be any I bequeath the same to Laura A. Reed I give to Ann W. Dennis, the following slave, to wit, Jason and Harriet together with any increase of the said slave, after the date of this will to her and her heirs, forever, I also give to the said Ann W. Dennis, and Agent N. Reed the following slave, to wit, Collin Law Branch, Balina, Margaret and Caroline children of Amanda and little Tom together with any increase of the said slave, after the date of this will, to them and their heirs forever subject to the following conditions: First it is my will that the said six slaves last named and their increase, shall immediately after my decease, be delivered to Laura A. Reed and held by her and left entirely discretionary with her when and at what time she shall deliver the said slaves to the said Ann W. Dennis, and Agent N. Reed; Secondly it is further my will that if the said Ann W. Dennis die without issue here in that case at the decease of the said Ann W. Dennis, the one half of the last named six slaves together with any increase of the said slaves after the date of this will which shall have been apportioned to the said Ann W. Dennis and held by her during her lifetime, at her decease shall be immediately delivered to Laura A. Reed to be owned held and disposed of by the said Laura A. Reed as she may think proper. And to effectuate fully this my intention I do hereby authorize my executors and my esteemed friend Laura A. Reed, at the time when the said Laura A. Reed may think proper to deliver the said six slaves to the said Ann W. Dennis & Agent N. Reed, to divide and assign to the said Ann W. Dennis and Agent N. Reed, to each one third moiety in the said slaves, together with any increase of the said slaves, share and share alike for the purposes and conditions aforesaid. I give to Doctor Albert G. Reed and Laura A. Reed his wife, all my other property or any other Estate of which I may die seized or possessed or may be entitled to and I do hereby make and ordain Doctor Albert G. Reed Executor of this my Last Will and

Testament. In witness whereof I Ann N. Branch have to this my will set my hand and seal this 16th day of February in the year of our Lord 1853.
