Renunciation of Will

Bublaker of the County of Roanoke and State of
Va. being of feeble health, and conscious of the
brutality of human life, but being of sound mind
and disposing memory do make and ordain
this my last will and Testament. It is my will
to make the following disposition of my worldly
estate.

1st I direct that all my just debts due at my
decease and my funeral expense be paid by my
Executor hereinafter named, out of my estate, as
soon after my decease as convenient.

2nd It is my request that my whole estate both
personal and real shall remain as it is, and

long as my Wife Susan lives

8th it is my request that after my decease if any money from Bonds I now have come into the hands of my executor that he pay my just debts & funeral expenses and put the remainder out at Interest - and at the Decease of my Wife Susan, then my Executor pay her funeral expenses and have common good tombstones put up over each of our Graves

4. it is my Will that my Grandson Elias B. Huffman to have all my real estate several different parcels after the Decease of myself & wife Susan, he the said C. B. Huffman is to pay each one of his Brother & Sisters my grand children five hundred dollars each, to be paid as followeth, one year after the Decease of myself & wife he the said C. B. Huffman is to pay each of his Brother & Sister that are Twenty one years old Two hundred & fifty dollars each - and Two years from the Decease of myself & wife he the said C. B. Huffman is to pay a second payment of Two hundred & fifty dollars each to all his Bros & Sister that are Twenty one years of age and continue to pay each one his Bros & Sister every year if they become of age until each one receive this five hundred dollars

5th it is my desire that my grand daughter Mammie Elizabeth Huffman is to, one bed and small chairs -

6th it is my desire that my grand child Matilda Jane Huffman is to have one bed

7th it is my desire that my grand child Lucy C. Huffman one bed

8th it is my request that the afore personal property given to my grand daughter remain in C. B. Huffman possession until the aforesaid children become of age or get

married if any of the afore named grand children should die before they become of age or get married the said personal property is to be the property of the said C. B. Huffman

9th it is my request that if any of my grand children should die before they become of age or get married - and have not received any part of their legacies that their part as aforesaid should be equally divided between the remainder of my grand children

10th I hereby appoint my grand Son Elias B. Huffman my executor of this my will and testament after carrying out & paying all the provisions of this will be the said C. B. Huffman is to have all effects arising from any moneys papers or any other source that may come into his hands

10th it is my direction that the aforesaid Executor is to receive no pay as executor
