

Calib Huffman. The last Will and testament of Calib Huffman.

I Call Hufferman, of Catawba, in the County of Roanoke,
State of Virginia, being mindful of my mortality, do this,
1st day of August, in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred
+ Seventy Nine (1879) write and publish this my last Will
and testament, in manner and form following.

First, I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife, Eliza, to be sole Executrix of this my last, will, directing my said Executrix to pay all my just debts, and funeral expenses.

Second After paying my said debts & funeral expenses I give to my youngest Daughter, Mary S. the sum of Four hundred Dollars, (\$400) to be used for her education or to make her equal in my Estate up to this date, with my Eldest Daughter, Betsey, on account of Education.

Third. I give and bequeath to my Wife my tract or parcel of land (250 acres) lying being in the county of Craig (on Craig's Creek,) also my $\frac{1}{5}$ interest in a tract or parcel of land on Mason's Creek, Rowan County, for her sole use, to hold or dispose of as she think best.

Fourth, I devise & bequeath to my said Executrix all the rest & residue of my real Estate, so long as she shall live to hold and use as her own.

Fifth. If Betty my Eldest Daughter, should marry before Mary S. becomes of age, my Executrix is directed to give her (Betty) such things as she thinks she needs to aid her, to go to house keeping &c.

Sixth, all of my personal property I leave to my wife to use as her own, until Mary S. my youngest Daughter becomes of age. I also request that after the death of my wife that my Daughters, Bettie & Mary S. shall share equal in all of my real & personal Estate.
