

Black R. Campbell In the name of God, Amen, I Black R. Campbell, being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make this my last will and testament.

First - I desire that after my death, all of my just debts shall be paid by my Executors hereinafter named.

I am not aware of being indebted to any one except to Ferguson & Gambell merchants at Big Lick, as I have always tried to keep myself out of debt.

Item - I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Lucy Campbell, all my real estate consisting of the tract of land on which I now live, and some lots of land situated in the town of Sainsborough, commonly called "The Old Lick" - all to be held by her during her natural life - with the rents and profits of the same - and at her death, I give and bequeath the said real estate, to my niece Hannie N. Williamson for her life and at her death then to her children, the heirs of her body, share and share alike.

Item - I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Lucy Campbell, all the personal property consisting of household and kitchen furniture, horses, cattle, hogs, farming implements, and such other personal estate as may be on the said real estate at my death, to be held and enjoyed and disposed of by her as she may desire.

Item - I give and bequeath unto my sisters Matilda Stoner and Susan Thrasher, the sum of five hundred dollars each, and to my niece Leticia Ward, the sum of five hundred dollars, and to the children of my late brother, Robert Campbell dead, namely, Merrimon L. Campbell, Angelina Carter, Virginia Morrison, the sum of five hundred dollars each, and to my nieces, Mary E. Nelson, Hannie N. Williamson, Elizabeth Hunter and Lucy E. Preston the sum of five hundred dollars each, all the above named legacies to my sisters, and nieces and nephews, to be paid by my Executors, as soon after my death as possible, out of my personal estate, other than the personal estate devised to my wife. The same devised to my sisters and nieces, namely \$500 - each and devised and to be held by them and each of them as their separate estate, to be used and disposed of by them as they may wish.

Item - In the event there should be left a balance of personal estate after the payment of the legacies above enumerated, then I give and bequeath the same to my beloved wife to be disposed of by her as she may think proper.

Item - I hereby appoint my beloved wife Lucy Campbell and William L. Williamson, my Executors to execute this my last will and testament, and desire that no security shall be required of them.

Item - I hereby revoke all wills and testaments heretofore made and acknowledged by me, acknowledging this above as my last will and testament.

 4th I will to my sister Polly Short one bureau one small table one white cow.
 5th I will to my nephew Edward Short son of George Short all the grain hay and fodder that I may have at my death after furnishing bread for Polly and Bettie Short for twelve months after my death. if I have any hogs or meat left at my death I want it equally divided between Edward
