In consideration of his help and assistance during our lives and that he be not charged up with any back rent.

Third- That after the death of my beloved wife Francis F. Oyler, I desire that the proceeds of all my property, both real and personal be equally divided among my children, viz. Robt S. and Bertie Lunny (who are the bodily heirs of my daughter Francis F. Lunny) John S. Oyler, Mary E. Campbell, Nannie C. Ollow, Sarah Jane Piggot, Thomas S. Oyler, Doan Oyler and Delila Ella Oyler.

Fourth- I nominate and appoint my beloved wife Francis F. Oyler, to be my executrix of this my last will and testament without security.

Second:- I direct that all my just debts be paid.

Third:- After the payment of my burial and funeral expenses and my just debts, in testimony of my affection for them, I give, devise and bequeath to my two sisters Matilda W. Jack and Elizabeth J. Jack absolutely and in fee simple, should both of them be living at my death, and in the event of the death of either before my demise, then to the survivor, all of my estate real, personal and mixed of whatever nature or kind in possession or expectancy whenever situated and being.

Fourth:- I appoint my said two sisters Matilda W. Jack and Elizabeth J. Jack, if both should be living at my death, executrix of this my last will and testament, and in the event of the death of either before my death, then I appoint the survivor executrix and desire that they, or the survivor shall not be required to give security upon their or her qualification.
