

Eliza A. Thomas. On the name of God Amen

I Eliza A. Thomas of the County of Roanoke State of Virginia being of sound mind and disposing memory, but in feeble health, do make and publish this as my last will and testament hereby revoking any and all previous testamentary hitherto made, having but little property which if sold and divided among my heirs at law would be of such small amount to each as would do them but little good and desiring to leave a home for those most in need of one.

I will and devise all my estate both real and personal to my youngest daughter Martha Louisa in fee simple subject to the following charges. First. My son E. Clifton having expended the sum of six hundred and fifty dollars in providing me a home in my old age. I direct that that amount be paid him and charge my estate with the payment of said sum.

Secondly I direct that my daughter Anna D. McElmahan shall have the right to a home and support out of my estate so long as she remains a widow, this right to be forfeited by her should she marry, she to live with my said daughter Martha Louisa in the exercise of this right.

On testimony whereof I hereby sign and seal this paper this the 21st day of May 1885.

Codicil.

Codicil No. 2.

I Eliza A. Thomas hereby make and publish this as a second codicil to my will dated the 21st day of May 1885. I devise to my son E. Clifton Thomas a two-fifths ($\frac{2}{5}$) interest in my real estate to be accepted by him in full satisfaction of all claims and demands against my estate hereby revoking the charge agst my estate of Six hundred and fifty dollars and substituting the above provision in lieu thereof. I further desire that my son John S. Thomas, shall have a home and support out of my estate so long as he remains single and unmarried.


