

Shanks, J. Helen Shanks, Anna P. White and Lucy N. Beller I give one of the eight divisions of my lands above provided to be made. I direct that the portion of the land which my daughter Martha E. Shanks shall take be held by her to her sole and separate use in fee simple. Except as to the conveyance which I have authorized Fanny Penn to make to two of my sons if she shall see fit to do so. I direct that the lands held by all my daughters be to their sole and separate use vesting in my married daughters only a life estate with the fee simple to their children, such fee simple to vest in the children immediately on the death of the mother, and if either of my children die childless being at the time of the death seized of any of the lands herein devised. I direct that the lands of such decedent descend in fee simple and equally to the surviving children of all of daughters.

Sixth. I give my cows and calves to Fanny Penn, my gold watch to Lucy N. Beller, my writing desk to J. Helen Shanks, my picture of _____ and my Majolica vases to Esper White Shanks, my motto to Maria L. Shanks, my table cloth and one dozen napkins given to me by Mr. Somerville to Martha E. Shanks, to Ann P. White my glass spoon stand, Majolica cream pot and butter dish to Mary B. Read the white counterpane and bureau cover made and given to me by my mother. All other things I have I leave with ^{Fanny Penn with} written instructions as to their disposal.
