I, G. B. Board of the County of Roanoke & State of Virginia being of sound mind and disposing memory but recognising the uncertainty of life do make this my last Will and Testament -

First at the time of my death I commend my soul to God

in whom I trust for salvation through Christ the Redeemer.

Second - I do hereby direct my executrix to set aside five thousand dollars which shall be paid to the Trustees of Roanoke College and expended by them in the improvement of my lot in the cemetery. Said Trustees are my friends & I confide in them the matter of this improvement. If any part of the \$5000. be not expended it shall be invested and the interest perpetually applied by said Trustees in keeping the said lot in repair. For this purpose I direct the sale of \$5000. Georgia Pacific Trust Mortgage Railroad bonds.

Third - I give to my dear wife Martha G. Board my house & lot in the town of Salem also my interest in the banking house and all my personal property that is to say, my household & kitchen furniture, horses, carriages harness &c. I also give to her all my stock in the Merchants National Bank of Richmond and all my stock in the Farmer's National Bank of Salem.

Fourth I would desire my dear wife at her death to devise to the Trustees of Roanoke College Five thousand dollars the income of which to be applied by said trustees, one-half to the further improvement of my cemetery lot and repairs on same and one half for the College endowment fund.

Fifth I give to my dear wife to be held by her in trust for the use and benefit of Susan King during the life time of my dear wife & at her death to be held by Susan King to her sole and separate use without the interposition of any trustee five thousand dollars of Georgia Pacific Construction bonds.

Sixth I now add that in addition to the devise to my dear wife I also give to her all my stock in the Bank of South West Virginia at Wytheville.

Seventh, I give to the Trustees of Roanoke College for endowment purpose Ten Thousand Dollars in Richmond and West Point Terminal Trust bonds.

Eighth, I give to my brother Thomas B. Board \$5000. in Petersburg Railroad class B. bonds.

Ninth. I give to my sister Gemima Bright, the same to be held by my brother John Board Dr., as trustee for her, \$5000. Chesapeake & Ohio class B. bonds. And said Trustees shall have the right to spend the principal as well as the interest for her benefit.

Tenth. I release W. J. Hurt from the payment of any debts I hold against him.

Eleventh. I release Dr. T. H. B. Dillard from the payment of all trust and judgment liens held by me against him upon condition that he give to my family as long as they live his professional services without charge.

Twelfth. I give to Charles C. Board, James G. Board and Samuel G. Board my half brothers each \$2000. in Wytheville town bonds

Thirteenth. I desire my friend D. B. Strouse to assist my dear wife in winding up my estate and to befriend her at all times and in recognition of such services I give to him five shares of my stock in the Bonsack Machine Company one-half of which he is to hold in trust for my name sake Clarence B. Strouse.

Fourteenth. I give to my niece Gemima Crawford five shares of stock in the Bonsack Machine Co.

Fifteenth. I give to my niece Olivia Green Noble five shares of stock in Bonsack Machine Co.

Sixteenth. I give to Lehas. F. Board & Walter Board each five shares of stock in the Bonsack Machine Co.

Seventeenth. I give to my brother John Board five shares of stock in the Bonsack Machine Company.

Eighteenth. All the residue of my estate I give to my dear wife Martha G. Board.

Nineteenth. I appoint my dear wife Martha G. Board my executrix and I direct that no bond as such be required of her, also that no appraisement be made nor any settlements required, she having delivered the various legacies set out in this will shall be free from any annoyance of settlement of any kind.

Twentieth. I release Frank (Francis Board) from the payment of a bond I hold against him.
