In the name of God - amen. I, Peter Bush, of
the County of Roanoke and State of Virginia, being
sick and weak in body, but of sound mind and
disposing memory, for which I thank my God, and
causing to mine the uncertainty of human life, and
being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as
it has pleased God to bless me with, so hereby make and
ordain my last Will & Testament, in the manner and form
as following that is today.

Item the first. I desire that all my just debts
and funeral expences be paid from the ~~rest~~ of any of
my property not hereafter specially willed.

Secondly. I have given to my son Thomas J. Bush
the tract of Land on which he now resides, or the amount
of Eighty Acres, as his full part to him & his heirs forever.

Thirdly. I have given to James Stewart and
Elizabeth his wife a negro girl by the name of Charity
to them and their heirs forever.

Fourthly. I have given to my son William Bush
one negro girl by the name of Maria and her increase
to him and his heirs forever.

Fifthly. I have given to my son Robert Bush
one negro girl by the name of Mary to him and
his heirs forever.

Sixtly. I have given to my son Griffen Bush
one negro girl by the name of Nancy and her increase
to him forever also a boy by the name of Henry by him
paying to my beloved wife one hundred dollars
when she may call or demand it.

Seventhly. I have given to Wm. Bush & his wife
one negro girl by the name of Louisa and
her increase to them and their heirs forever.

Eighthly. I give to my beloved wife Alice
Bush the following property to wit.

One negro girl by the name of Elizabeth
and her increase and also all my household and
Furniture of every kind, together with the house

the sale of my plantation which I have sold to James Stewart for the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, the amount of the purchase may one hundred & 17 acres of Land bought by me from Whittemore if he think proper to comply with his former contract that my wife and my Executor shall at any time when he shall meet his contract that they shall make him the right, or otherwise in case that he shall fail to pay for the land that he shall give up the plantation to my wife and pay the sum of Thirty Dollars a year rent for the same.

I gave it to her to be disposed of at her death or at any other period of her life at her will & pleasure. And lastly I constitute and appoint my son Griffis Bush my Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other former wills. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fix my seal the 27th day of Nov. 1840

At a Circuit Superior Court of Law & Chancery held for the County of Roanoke on Wednesday the 25th day of August 1841

The last Will & Testament of Peter Bush dec'd was, proved by the oath of W. Mace Sam'l G. Stewart and Peter J. Bush witnesses thereto, and is ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Griffis Bush the Executor therin named who made oath that he and together with William Beck and William Mace his decedite (each of whom qualified as to his sufficiency a security for the amount of the property of the Road) entered into and acknowledge their bond in the penalty of \$2000.00 conditioned as the law directs,

certified to a grantee him for obtaining a record of the said Will in due form

In the name of God amen. I, Eason Hannan of the County of Roanoke and State of Virginia, having been weak of body, but of sound and perfect mind, do make this my last Will & Testament in the manner following that is to say - First, I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God, and my body to the Earth to be decently buried; and after all my just debts & funeral expenses are paid, I devise & bequeath as follows. To my beloved wife Mary Hannan I give the whole of the plantation on which I now live, during her natural life, and at her death I give it to the children of Abraham Hannan, after paying to the heirs, thus in number, of my daughter Jane Baker dec'd fifty dollars each, and to the heirs of my daughter Elizabeth Hutchinson dec'd three in number fifty dollars each, and to my daughter Mary Ann Cooper One Hundred & fifty dollars, none of which is to be paid until two years after my decease, and the decease of my wife Mary Hannan, having heretofore giving to my sons Thomas, William, John Eason & Edward fifty acres of Land each in their full share of my Estate both real & personal. I also direct that my Executor sell so much of my Land after the death of myself and my wife, as will be sufficient to pay my debts and the legacies above directed. I also give to my wife Mary Hannan all my other property of any kind, to be at disposal at this will & pleasure. To carry this my last will into full effect, I do constitute & appoint my son William
