sick and weak in body, but of sound mind & disposing
memory (for which I thank God) and calling to mind
the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous to

manner following that is to say. = 1st I desire that all
the perishable ~~perishable~~ parts of my Estate be sold as soon
as my Executor hereafter named may deem most ad-
= visable after my decease, and out of the monies
arising from all my just debt & funeral expenses
be paid. Should the perishable parts of my property
prove insufficient for the above purposes, then I desire
my Executor hereafter named, may pay out of the
monies arising from the sale of my Real Estate,
(known by the name of the Boltcomb Spring) and
satisfy such of my just debt as shall remain
unpaid out of the sale of the perishable part of my
Estate.

2^d I wish my part of the Boltcomb Spring sold
at such a price and at such a period as my Ex-
= ecutor hereafter named, may, in consultation with
brother James, may think most fit and proper.

3^d After the payment of my debt & funeral
Expenses, I give to my wife Catharine one third
part of my Estate, both real & personal, for & during
the term of her natural life, and after her decease
I give the same to my son James Callaway Blain.

4th I give to my son James Callaway Blain
the balance of my Estate, both real & personal, and
which I wish to be managed by my Executor to the
best advantage for his benefit

5th All the rest of my Estate, both real and
personal of whatever nature & kind soever it may be, or
hereafter ^{be} more particularly disposed of, I desire

And lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my friend George P Taylor, Executor of this my last Will & Testament, hereby revoking all other former Wills & Testaments by me heretofore made.
