Hurietta L. Powers. I Hurietta L. Powers of Salem Virginia, do make and declare this my last Will and testament, hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made.

Capt R. B. Moorman owes me \$9,000. bearing 6% per year interest payable annually on the 1st of Sept. of each year, the principal sum of \$9,000. is not to be paid until one, two and three years after my death, for which I hold his three bonds for \$3,000 each dated the 1st Sept. 1870.

1st I will and bequeath to my sister Sarah J. Johnston, subject to the payment of my debts and funeral expense, (if I have any debts) all the interest that may be due on said \$9,000 at my death, and which is to become due after my death, until the last of the three bonds are due and payable.

2nd I will and bequeath to my nephew, Alexander Johnston, the principal sum of the first bond of \$3,000. due me from Capt. R. B. Moorman, to be paid him when due, that is one year after my death.

3rd I will and bequeath the principal sum of the remaining two bonds of \$3,000 each due me from Capt. R. B. Moorman, making \$6,000. to the Trustees of Union Theological Seminary in Prince Edward County, Virginia, to be paid to them as each become due, that is \$3,000. two years after my death and \$3,000. three years after my death, to be by them used in aiding indigent students (such as they may select) in their preparation for the gospel ministry in the Presbyterian Church.

4th I will and bequeath to my former servant Sylvia Barker, the house in which she now lives, with the ground thereto attached as now fenced off, for a house for herself.

5th I will and bequeath to my sister Sarah J. Johnston during her life, my house in which I now live in Salem Va and the residue of the lot, together with all my furniture, beds and bedding carpets, books, pictures and all my property not herein

otherwise disposed of, and at her death the same shall pass to & be the property of my nephew Alexander Johnston to be by him and his family held and enjoyed in fee simple, free from any liability of any debts of the said Alexander Johnston.

6 It is my wish that my lot in East Hill Cemetery be used for the burial of Presbyterian Ministers and their families who may die in Salem Va

7th I do not desire to have an executor and believing it may be legally done, I direct that Capt Moorman, do pay direct to the parties named in this my will the portions herein named when the same are payable by the provisions of this my will and the terms of our contract dated 6 April 1870 and the receipts said parties or their representatives, for the same when all are paid shall be authority to the trustee in the deed of Trust provided for in the said contract of the 6 April 1870 to execute a deed of release on said property to said Capt R. B. Moorman or to such a as he may direct.
