This 18th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty two Signed sealed published & declared by the testator as his last Will and testament in presence of us

Know all men by these presents that we, Liciorn S. Hunt, William McCauley, J. J. Chapman & J. C. Lutz and Wm. Seizinger of the County of Roanoke, State of Virginia, are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Virginia in the first and full sum of Five thousand Dollars to which payment, well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals and dated this 3rd day of May 1867.

The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above named Liciorn S. Hunt hath been by order of George Stoneman, Brigadier General U. S. A. Commanding the First Military District, dated Richmond, Va, March 26th 1867 appointed Clerk of the Circuit Court of Roanoke County, State of Virginia, to fill the vacancy caused by the removal of Wm McCauley from Office in accordance with General Order No. 24 dated March 15th 1867 and is empowered and directed to perform all the duties of the said Office according to law until his successor shall be duly elected or appointed and qualified. Now if the above named Liciorn S. Hunt shall faithfully discharge the duties of his Office aforesaid according to law then the above obligation to be void, else to remain

in full force and virtue.
