humbly certify my last Will & Testament as follows, viz King

First, I direct that all my just debts, so far as I may
be concerned, and my funeral expenses shall be paid.
Second, I will and bequeath to my sister Fannie G.
Walter, for and during the natural life time of my said
sister, my negro girl slave named Patsy, and upon the
death of my said sister, I bequeath the said negro girl
and her increase to my niece Clementina Walter.
Third, I give to my nephew F. H. Watson six slaves to wit
Fourth, I direct that my slave Patsy, as soon as she
be sold, and it is my wish that they shall be permitted
to choose their masters. I also authorize and direct my
Exors, Adors & Asors to make sale of all Real Estate and interests in
Real Estate to which I am entitled whenever located and

real estate to which I am entitled, whenever located, and particularly my interest in lands in Texas; and the proceeds arising from such sales, both of slaves and real estate together with all the rest and residue of my property and estate, of whatever nature or kind (except the property disposed of above in the second and third clause) I wish and am legally empowered to share equally with my three children, as follows: - First, I direct that one hundred dollar share of what he applies to the executor of my family Burgey Inured at or near Pattersonburg in Rich-land County - Next, I direct that three hundred dollar shall be paid to my nephew Thaddeus Watson, which I hereby bequeath to him; and these all the residue is to be divided into three equal parts, one of which I give to my sister Mrs. Christiana L. Watson, another part I give to my sister Sarah P. Drinkwater, and the remaining part to my sister Fannie G. Watson. And this I request to my sister Mrs. Drinkwater is to be for her sole and separate use.
