I still own a house and lot on Chapman Street in said town - I own one hundred and sixty four shares of the Bradshaw Arms and Iron Springs Company's stock, I own ten shares of the covenant building and loan Association stock, of Knoxville Tennessee I own ten shares of the United Banking and Building Company stock of Richmond Virginia I own twenty shares of stock in the Salem Building and Investment Company, Salem Va in my own name, and own ten shares of the same stock standing in the name of James W. Palmer, the assessments of which I have paid I own five shares of stock in the Gas Heating Stock Company of Salem Virginia I appoint my dear wife, Virginia W. Palmer my executrix, and direct that she be allowed double commissions in the settlement of my estate.
