1. I give and bequeath to my wife E. S. Terry all of Crops on my farm at my death several of growing my Carriage and pair of horses & harness also all the Hogs & Sheep on said farm also the plantation tools & utensils one ox woggon, one two horse woggon, one yoke of Oxen house hold & kitchen furniture, in fee simple provide my wife set up no claim against my estate, if she does in that event the whole of the above devise is to be sold as the property of my estate.

I further devise to my said wife, for & during her natural life only my residence, Residence on the farm above said with two hundred acres of land around it,

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the same to be laid off by my executor so as to make a farm convenient in shape.

I further more devise to my wife a right of way through my land to the public road, also the sum of five hundred dollars to be paid her out of my estate, in one, two, three, four & five years, provided she grieve in any deeds that it may be necessary - in settling up my estate, the afore said provision for my wife is to be in full of her dower & distributive share of my estate and in full of all & any claim whatsoever against my Estate.

2. All the rest & residue of my Estate of every kind & kind, whatsoever, I give, devise & bequeath to my Son J. Colles Ferry in fee simple including the reversion of the lands used by my wife for life.

3. I appoint my Son J. Colles Ferry my Executor of this my will, and I particularly request that no security be required of him and that there be no inventory or appraisement of my estate. Written wholly by myself.
