First. I desire That my just debts and funeral ex-
penses be paid as soon after my decease as
conveniently may be and to That end charge
my whole estate real and personal with the
same:

Second - I give and bequeath to Mrs Jane Byrd who has been with me as long the following personal property belonging to me to be selected by her, to-wit: ^{one bedstead} one large and one small feather bed; ^{one} ~~one~~ crazy quilt; one bureau; two counterpanes; two sets of pillows; four sheets; four comforts; two blankets; six new towels; a new shawl; a piece of bleached cloth for making pillow cases; and four hundred dollars in money, part of which is to be paid her out of the gold which I have.

Third - The residue of my estate of what-
ever description, real, personal, or mixed, I
give bequeath and demise to my two ne-
phews John Day Howbert and Hugh De-
muthius Howbert to be equally divided
between them.

For witness whereof I have to this my will set my hand this 18th day of September in the year of our Lord 1894. You instead interlined above before signing.

I John Gamand of the County of Roanoke, in the State of Virginia, being of sound mind and disposing Memory, and recognizing the uncertainty of life, and the certainty of death do make this my last will and testament.

I direct that my body shall have a decent burial.

I direct that all debts due me, if any, shall be collected, and all my just debts, if any, shall be paid.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Juan B. Garman, all lands and Tenements of which I may die seized and possessed, also two horses and two cows to be selected by herself, all my farming implements, harness, wagon and buggy, all household and kitchen furniture, except the sewing machine and one bedstead and bedding, to have, hold and use the same during her natural life, and I also direct that all money which I may have on hand, or in bank at the time of my death, shall be loaned, and the interest on the same shall be paid to my said wife, annually, during her natural life.

I give and bequeth unto my daughter Mary Elizabeth Garmand the sewing machine, one bedstead and bedding, and one cow, or if the number of cows are not sufficient for her to have one, she shall be entitled, in lieu thereof to the value of one cow, in in money.

The residue of my personal property, if any, shall

among my children, as hereinafter directed.

After the death of my said wife, the property, both real and personal, herein bequeathed to her, shall be sold at auction, upon such terms as my executor shall deem most advantageous, and the money which shall have been loaned for her benefit shall be collected.

I direct that all my money, as soon as available for that purpose shall be distributed among my children as follows. First to my son Amos G. Garmand and my daughter Mary Elizabeth Garmand, one hundred dollars each, to make them equal with my other children each of whom has heretofore received a like amount. And the residue shall equally distributed among all my children.

I hereby appoint and constitute D. C. Kefauver as executor of this my last will and testament.

I direct, that in case my said wife shall again marry, that all ~~this~~ provision made for her herein, shall be void from the time of such marriage, and my executor shall proceed to carry out the provisions of this will.

Foreyth & heirs of Sarah Everleyn Ligon, 3^d John & Anneline Ligon & Tom Ligon. I also give to my said wife all the household furniture Beds, Bedding Books and all other household articles. Provisions and other consumable stores and all money which shall be in or about my said dwelling and elsewhere at the time of my death. For her sole and separate use I also claim the homestead on all debts made before the year 1895, and up to the time of my death, and I request and direct my executrix to carry out my request without fail.
