Banks of the County of Roanoke State of Virginia, do make this my last Will, and testament as follows, first I give, and bequeath to my beloved Wife Sarah Elizabeth Banks all my real, and personal estate, of which I die seized and possessed of, on the following conditions, that she the said Sarah Elizabeth Banks shall provide for my Mother Sylvia Banks so far as she is able to do so, also that, my Mother shall occupy the room, she now resides in unmolested. I farther direct, and request of Jacob S. Baer that he secure a deed from J. C. Green Trustee to my Wife, and Sister Maria Susan Banks, for thirteen ¹³ acres, and forty poles of land, which has been fully paid for, location Brushy Mountain. I also desire if there is ever any question raised by the Heirs of my Father Ferdinand Banks in regard to the right, and Title of the real estate upon which I now reside I desire that my Estate be allowed by appraisers the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400) the actual cost of building the dwelling house on the same, or what ever amount they may deem a just compensation for the building the said house. I hereby appoint my Wife Sarah Elizabeth my administratrix, and Executrix without being required to give any security.



And my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian apparel at the discretion of my Executors not doubting but at general Resurrection I shall receive same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly Estate where with it pleased God to blss me in this life, I give devise and dispose of the same in following manner, Item 1st after the payment of my just debts, I give unto my son William W. Deyere all of my lands in Texas and my cow farm 420 Acres (S. value \$17776-) Also one half of my House hold & Kitchen furniture, to be divided between him & his sister Maggie without Publick Sale, & I give to my daughter Maggie Bushong my Home Farm including 14 ³/₄ acres lying at the foot of Greenwood and heirs of her body for twenty one years except Taxes & Repairs or till her youngest child become of age. Then to do as they think best (S. value her lands at \$17887-) But think it will be worth double in ten years.

I do nominate constitute and appoint my son William W. Deyere Executor and my daughter Maggie to Bushong Executrix, To this last Will and Testament where of I have hereunto set my hand affixed my seal this the Twelfth day of January one thousand eight hundred & eighty nine
