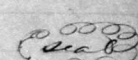
First, it is my will and desire that all my just debts and Funeral Expenses be paid

Thirdly, all the Rest, and residue of my Estate, whether Real or Personal I give unto my Brother James Scott (of Muhlenburg County Kentucky) to him and his heirs forever Last, I do hereby constitute and appoint George H. Zirkle Executor of this my last Will and Testament

At Roanoke County Court, January Term (Friday 25th) 1878.

George H. Zirkle who is nominated the Executor of the last Will and Testament of John Scott deceased, this day

propounded the said Will for probate, and it having been shown to the Court that James C. Ledbetter, and Griffin T. Ledbetter the subscribing witnesses to said Will are unable from sickness to attend this Court, it is ordered that a commission be issued and annexed to said Will directed to James W. Palmer a Commissioner in Chancery of the Circuit Court of Roanoke County, to take the deposition of the said James C. Ledbetter and Griffin T. Ledbetter, whose duty it shall be to take the same.

And at Roanoke County Court January Term (Saturday 21st) 1878. The last Will and Testament of John Scott deceased was this day produced in Court together with the depositions of James C. Ledbetter and Griffin T. Ledbetter, subscribing witnesses thereto taken under a commission directed on motion to be issued. And the said depositions having been read in Court, and it appearing that the same are in due and legal form, it is ordered that the said Will be recorded as and for the last Will and Testament of the said John Scott deceased.

Thomas. In the name of God - Amen.

I Elias Thomas of Catawba Roanoke County Va being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former will by me at any time heretofore made.

And as to my worldly estate, and all the property, real personal, or mixed of which I shall die seized and possessed, or to which I shall be entitled at the time of my decease, I devise, bequeath, and dispose thereof in the following manner to wit:

First. My will is, that all my just debts and funeral expenses, shall, by my executors hereinafter named, be paid out of my estate as soon after my decease as shall be found by them convenient.

Second. My Beloved wife Mary Thomas if she should be living at the time of my death is to have the entire use of the estate, to be controlled by my executor hereafter named, as long as she may live ("I.E.") that the entire profits of the estate is to be appropriated to her support.

Third. At the death of my wife, if she should outlive me, my will is, that the entire estate shall be sold, by my executors on such time as they may deem best, for the interest of the estate and be equally divided among my children as follows, an equal portion of the estate shall, be given to Emeline Jeter, Elizabeth Barnett, if she should be living at the time of my death, if not, then her part to be equally divided between the balance.
