In the name of God, Amen I Joel Grisso, of Roanoke County Virginia, being afflicted but of sound and perfect mind and memory and considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof do make and appoint this my last will and testament, in the manner and form following, to wit:
First and principally I commit my soul to God, in humble hopes of its future happiness and my body to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial—
2nd I request that all of my estate both real and personal property shall be sold at public sale in due time after my death and all my just debts paid out of the proceeds of the sale of my property, whatsoever just debts there may be standing against me,
3rd I give to my wife Matilda Grisso, at the time of my death, one third part of the net proceeds of sale in cash of my personal property whatsoever personal property I may have

at the time of my death, for her to have and hold and dispose of as she may think proper for her own use and benefit.

I also give to my wife, one third part in cash of the net proceeds of the sale of my Real Estate for her to have and hold and dispose of as she may think proper for her own special use and benefit, But provided my wife takes her thirds of my Real Estate in hand, said thirds shall return back to my nearest relatives at the time of her death.

4th I will and bequeath to my nephew Joel Grisso, the son of James + Nancy Grisso, the sum of \$200. Two hundred Dollars to be cared for by his father until he reaches (21) years of age and kept upon interest. 5th I will and bequeath to my brother and sister Daniel Grisso, and Martha Grisso the sum of \$300. Three hundred Dollars to each of them, said legacies amounting to the sum of Eight hundred Dollars to be paid out of the proceeds of sale of my estate. 6th I will and bequeath the remainder of my estate whatever there may be left to be equally divided amongst all of my brothers and sisters, namely Susan Brubaker, Mary Brubaker, W. E. Grisso, James Grisso, Sary Henry, Jam Henry, Daniel Grisso, and Martha Grisso.

And truly I do appoint the Sheriff of Roanoke County Va. sole Executor of this my last will and testament ratifying and confirming this and none other to be my last will and testament.
