1st I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth C Persinger the land which I now reside, and all the appurtenance belonging thereto, likewise a piece of Wood land said to contain two and a half acres @ joining the land of the widow Dillard and widow Gratz.

2^o I also give her my negro by Johnson, all the household and kitchen furniture, and all the stock of every kind, plantation utensils, and my riding carriage. Likewise eight hundred dollars now in Bank in Salem

I also will five hundred dollars to Sophia W. P. Powell I have given all my sons and daughters their portion and shall not give them any more I will to two of Sarah Gratz's sons (the two that I have never given any thing) three hundred dollars apiece I give to my grand-daughter Catharine Worthy and her children one thousand dollars in a bond I hold against Noah Worthy

After all my just debts and funeral expenses are paid, I will that whatever may be left be given to George B Persinger's children. This is to be paid out

as min. testator without giving any security in this my Will and Testament, which I now sign and seal this 19th May 1857.

At Roanoke June Court 1858

The last Will and Testament of John Persinger deceased with a Codicil thereto attached, dated the 2nd day of May 1857 was this day produced in Court and the said Codicil was proved in part by the oaths of Charles L. Cocke one of the subscribing witnesses thereto, and the same is contained for full they say so of.

At Roanoke July Court 1858 the last Will and Testament of John Persinger deceased with the Codicil thereto annexed, was again produced in Court, and the Codicil to said Will was for this proved by the oath of H. S. Linnman one of the subscribing witnesses thereto. It was also proved by the oaths of C. E. Harrison (writer of C. E. Harrison) that C. E.

Harrison one of the subscribing witnesses to the said Will is dead, and that his signature thereto is genuine. And it further appearing to the Court that James M. Clancy Esq. another subscribing witness to the said Will is now sickly age, and infirmity is unable to attend the Court

it is therefore ordered that a Commissioner to take the deposition of the said James M. Clancy Esq. be found annexed to the said Will and directed to F. Johnston, a Commissioner authorized by law to take deposition in this case -

At Roanoke August Court 1858 came into Court
