In the name of God, Amen, I Alexander Anderson of Salem, Roanoke County, Virginia, do make this my last will and Testament as follows, after all of my just debts and the funeral expenses have been paid.

1. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lottie Booker Anderson the lower North room and all the furniture the room contained at my death with ingress and egress through the building which has a passage or hall, one sixth of the lot I now own in the town of Salem fronting on Water Street and being the centre of the front of the lot.

2. I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph Pearl Anderson, the upstairs of the Northern room and one sixth of the lot in the town of Salem now owned by me to be laid off in the Northwest corner of said land.

3. I give bequeath and devise unto my daughter Jennie Calaforo and Henry Calaforo and their heirs, the North-eastern corner of the lot which I

I now own in the Town of Salem facing Water Street one sixth of said lot.

4. I give and bequeath to my son John Anderson, one sixth of the lot I now own in the Town of Salem fronting on Water Street. The said one sixth lot to be laid off directly west of the lot bequeathed to Lottie Booker Anderson, and adjoining the south side of the lot bequeathed to Joseph Anderson.

5. I give and bequeath to my daughter Lula Anderson, one sixth of the lot now owned by me in the Town of Salem fronting on Water Street. The said one sixth to be taken from the South-eastern corner of said land, together with the South-lower room, or building on said land. She is also to have egress and ingress through the hall way of said building.

6. I give and bequeath to my son George Anderson, one sixth of the lot I now own situated on Water Street in the Town of Salem. The said one sixth to be taken from the South-West corner of said lot and immediately West of the lot I bequeath to my daughter Lula Anderson, and adjoining the South the lot I bequeath to my son John Anderson, and adjoining the North side of Phoebe Wright's lot.

7. I appoint John H. Duckwild as the guardian of my children, Joseph C. Anderson, Lottie Booker Anderson and George Anderson as at the time of my death shall be under the age of twenty-one years; and I desire that no security shall be required of him as such guardian.

8. I hereby revoke all previous wills and codicils hitherto made by me. Witness my hand this ninth-day of January in the year of our Lord 1898.

9. I appoint J. H. Camper, Esq., my executor of this my will and desire that no security shall be of him as such
