1. I direct that my burial and funeral expenses be paid by my executor, ^{out} of the first money that comes in his hands.

2. I direct that all of my just debts be paid as soon after my demise as may be convenient by my Executor.

3. I direct that all of my personal and real estate after my just debts are paid, be kept together until my youngest child becomes twenty one year of age, except five acres more less that my son Deval had partly bargained for if he still wants the land for the sum of One hundred & fifty Dollars my Executor to receive the same and put it in interest untill the rest of the land be sold.

4. I further direct that my wife Ruth Newman shall have choice of one acre of land or twenty five Dollars in money ^{whichever}

ever she may choose and also a child's part of my estate.

I direct that my Daughter Mary Susan shall have fifteen dollars Extra for money loaned me while sick to be paid her by my Executor before he makes the division. I hereby appoint F. A. Elder my Executor.

I direct my Executor after paying out all the aforesaid request in this Will the residue after selling every thing and paying all expenses whatever shall be equally divided between my lawful heirs. As witness my hand and seal this the 20 day of Sept. 1890.
