

Lewis Ziskle. In the name of God Amen.

I Lewis Ziskle of the County of Roanoke State of Virginia being of sound mind and disposing memory but in feeble health, do make and publish this as my last Will and testament revoking all others I may have at any time heretofore made.

1st I direct all of my just debts be paid.

2nd I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Susan all of the Estate I may die possessed of whether real, personal or mixed. In the event that she survives me I will that she have all my Estate in fee simple to be disposed of as she may think best, either by deed or will executed according to the law of Virginia.

Should my said wife depart this life before I do, then in that event I direct that all the residue of my Estate after the payment of my just debts, be divided equally among my eight children as follows, George W. Ziskle, Mary wife of H. C. Hatcher, Francis wife of James W. Johnston Elizabeth L. wife of John L. Pitger, Mary the wife of C. M. Hartman Ellen J. Ziskle, Anna L. Ziskle and John L. Ziskle charging each of them with advances heretofore made them as follows, H. C. Hatcher and Mary his wife with (\$1366⁰⁰) One thousand three hundred and sixty six dollars George W. Ziskle with (\$1283⁰⁰) One thousand two hundred and eighty three dollars James W. Johnston and Francis his wife with (\$1283) One thousand two Hundred & Eighty three dollars. Should I advance these or any of the other of my said children anything or any money after this time and before my death I direct such be charged to them in the final distribution of my estate. Should either of my said children ^{die} before my estate is divided I direct that the children of such take the share of their parent.

I direct that the portion of my Estate going to my daughters be for their sole and separate use independent of the control and debts of their present or any future husbands.

In the event of the death of my wife before my death or should she fail to dispose of the estate herein left her, then I direct my Executor to sell my real estate for distribution among my children as herein before provided, and for this purpose he shall have power to execute a proper deed to the purchaser or purchasers - said sale to be either publicly or privately as my said Executor may deem best.

I appoint my son Geo. W. Ziskle Executor of this my last Will and testament and desire he be allowed to qualify without giving security. Given under my hand and seal this 1st day of June 1883.

Hurietta L. Powers. I Hurietta L. Powers of Salem Virginia, do make and declare this my last Will and testament, hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made.

Capt R. B. Moorman owes me \$9,000. bearing 6% per year interest payable annually on the 1st of Sept. of each year, the principal sum of \$9,000. is not to be paid until one, two and three years after my death, for which I hold his three bonds for \$3,000 each dated the 1st Sept. 1870.

1st I will and bequeath to my sister Sarah J. Johnston, subject to the payment of my debts and funeral expense, (if I have any debts) all the interest that may be due on said \$9,000 at my death, and which is to become due after my death, until the last of the three bonds are due and payable.

2nd I will and bequeath to my nephew, Alexander Johnston, the principal sum of the first bond of \$3,000. due me from Capt. R. B. Moorman, to be paid him when due, that is one year after my death.

3rd I will and bequeath the principal sum of the remaining two bonds of \$3,000 each due me from Capt. R. B. Moorman, making \$6,000. to the Trustees of Union Theological Seminary in Prince Edward County, Virginia, to be paid to them as each become due, that is \$3,000. two years after my death and \$3,000. three years after my death, to be by them used in aiding indigent students (such as they may select) in their preparation for the gospel ministry in the Presbyterian Church.

4th I will and bequeath to my former servant Sylvia Barker, the house in which she now lives, with the ground thereto attached as now fenced off, for a house for herself.

5th I will and bequeath to my sister Sarah J. Johnston during her life, my house in which I now live in Salem Va and the residue of the lot, together with all my furniture, beds and bedding carpets, books, pictures and all my property not herein
