angant. In the name of God, Amen. I, Julia M. Vanzant, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this to be my last ^{will} and testament, as follows.

I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid from my personal estate as soon as practicable after my death, by my executrix hereinafter named.

First, I give and bequeath unto my daughter Alice V. Shumate, for and during her natural life, the house and lot in which she now lives, the said lot being recently taken from the property on which I live - with a frontage on Curwell Street in the town of Salem of forty (40) feet and running back between parallel lines to Ballou Street, the line between this lot and R. H. Ligon forming the Western boundary - and at her death, to her two children John M. and Elmer L. Brinkerhoff, and in the event of either dying without lawful issue of his body, then the other to have his share, and in the event of both dying without lawful issue, then to my two children John Vanzant and Lila M. Fowler, or the heirs of their body.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lila M. Fowler, the house and lot in which I now live, lying east of the lot devised to my daughter Alice V. Shumate, also all my household and kitchen furniture, and all my
