

Lydia Bradley In the name of God, Amen!

I Lydia Bradley of the County of Roanoke and State of Virginia, do hereby make this my last Will and Testament revoking all wills by me at any time heretofore made.

- 1<sup>st</sup> I direct that all my funeral expenses and just debts be paid out of the first money which may come into the hands of my Executor.
  - 2<sup>d</sup> I desire and direct that the real estate which I may own at my death be held and its rents and profits be enjoyed by my husband Allen Bradley so long as he may live, but my said husband is not to have the privilege of disposing of any part of my real estate.
  - 3<sup>r</sup> I direct that my personal property or such thereof as may be necessary be sold immediately after my death and the proceeds thereof be applied to the payment of the special legacies hereinafter named, and the property dissolved, (if any there be,) I give and bequeath to my said husband to be used and disposed of by him as he may think proper.
  - 4<sup>t</sup> I give and bequeath to my nephew George H. Rain One Hundred Dollars.
  - 5<sup>o</sup> I give and bequeath to my niece Mrs Mary Evans One Hundred Dollars.
  - 6<sup>o</sup> I give and bequeath to my two sisters Catharine Rain and Mrs Betsy Shank Fifty Dollars each.
  - 7<sup>o</sup> I give and bequeath to my nephews John Shank and my niece Mrs Sarah E. Tracy each twenty five dollars.
- If there will not be sufficient property and money on hand to pay the legacies aforesaid I desire that said legacies be paid totally to the extent of the value of said property and said money and the deficiency supplemented by the sale of my real estate as hereinbefore provided.
- 8<sup>o</sup> I direct that my Executor do upon the death of my said husband sell at public auction to the highest bidder, upon due notice and upon such terms as he may deem best all my real estate and invest the proceeds thereof in some safe security for the uses and benefits of the paupers of Roanoke County, the amount in trust of said investment to be paid to the Board of Supervisors of said County and disbursed by them in defraying the annual expenses of the Poor House, or in supporting paupers not at the place of general reception, but thence upon the funds of the County, as in their judgment they may think best.
  - 9<sup>o</sup> I hereby constitute and appoint Jas. Henton my Executor of this my last Will and Testament. Witness my hand and seal this 11<sup>th</sup> day of July in the year Eighteen Hundred and Twenty Four.

After some hesitation, I have concluded that it would be best, perhaps for me to make a will; although, except some personal effects and a few old debts, I do not know that there is any thing I have a right to dispose of by will. All I formerly owned, except as above mentioned, was lost by the result of the war; and all the property since acquired by the family, including houses, cattle, and other stock, as well as wagons and farming implements of every description, also, piano &c &c has been procured by means derived from the estate of Mr H. Birrell; and over this property as acquired I claim no control. But as to my own property and effects, and whatsoever I may in any way be entitled to, after payment of my debts and funeral expenses, I hereby give and bequeath the same to my wife Martha D. Logan. My watch, in particular, I wish her to accept as an acknowledgement of her uniform patience, kindness, and affection towards me, especially in my sickness.

I desire that no appraisement or sale be made of my property. I appoint my son, Robert Logan, executor of this my last will and testament, with the request that he be permitted to qualify without security.
