

Mark B. Sessler. I Mark P. Sessler of the County of Roanoke State of Virginia, being of sound mind and knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, make this my last will and testament. I give, devise, and bequeath my estate and property, real and personal, as follows. To wit, I give and bequeath all of my personal and real estate to my five (5) grand children, each one to have equal share after all of my burial and funeral expenses are paid; I want the land sold and the money divided: after paying expenses for selling the said land. I appoint John P. Sessler of the County of Botetourt State of Virginia, Executor of this my last will. I further decree that Mili Trout shall have out of the proceeds of the land before any division be made, (to the first named 5 grand children,) One-hundred Dollars, (100\$)

In witness whereof, I have signed and sealed and published and declared this instrument as my last will and Testament
