Muscogee County 3 I Mary A. James of this State of Georgia and County of Muscogee being of sound and disposing mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of life do therefore make this my last Will and Testament.

Item 1st After paying all just demands against my estate and discharging such other bequests as may be hereinafter granted, I hereby give and bequeath all the remainders of my estate both real and personal, unto my five children now living, namely Alfred R. James - Son of James, William A. James, Mary E. Clemons - wife of Wilcome E. Clemons - & Isabelle H. Selden - wife of Dr. Charles Selden. The same to be divided equally - each receiving one fifth of the whole: That portion going to Mary E. Clemons and to Isabelle H. Selden to be for their sole use and benefit and free from all debts, liabilities and contracts of their present or any future husbands they may have; and after them to their offspring should any be living at their death.

Item 2^d I hereby appoint Wilcome E. Clemons - husband of my daughter Mary and William A. James, trustees for the property herein bequeathed to Mary E. Clemons, to have sole control and management of the same, as in their judgment may be best for her interest.

Item 3^d I hereby appoint Dr. Charles Selden - husband of my daughter Isabelle - and William A. James, Trustees for the property herein bequeathed to Isabelle H. Selden, to have sole control & management of the same as in their judgment may seem best to promote the interest of my said daughter Isabelle.

Item 4. I hereby appoint Wilcome E. Clemons, husband of my daughter Mary, and my son William A. James Executors of this my last will and testament, and request them to pay all debts that may be justly due by me, and settle up the estate as soon as the same can be done without jeopardizing the interests of any of the parties.
