Item - I give and bequeath to Lucy J. Thrasher widow of Dr. Leroy Thrasher the sum of five hundred dollars.

Item - I give and devise to Black C. Edington the sum of five hundred dollars.

Item - I give and devise to John M. Petty and Mary E. Petty the sum of five hundred dollars each.

Item - I give and devise to Margaret M. Lively the sum of five hundred dollars.

Item - I give and bequeath to Jane Green (Colored) the sum of five hundred dollars.

Item - I give and devise to Mary C. Preston wife of Isaac Preston five hundred dollars.

Item - I give and devise to Merriam Campbell Angeline Carper, and Virginia Morrison the sum of two hundred dollars each.

Item - I give and bequeath to Ann Webb and Mandana Young of Texas the sum of two hundred dollars each.

- Item - I give and devise to David Bumbough the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars.
- Item - I give to Emory Parity the bond of three hundred dollars which I hold on him.
- Item - I give and devise to Marshall Parity the sum of three hundred dollars.
- Item - I give and bequeath to Sallie Petty my horse and buggy.
- Item - I give and devise to Mary Nelson the amount of a bond I hold against her husband Dandridge Nelson.
- Item - I give and devise to James C. Martin son of Am^m Martin and Dandridge Nelson the sum of five hundred dollars each which has already been paid to Am^m Martin and Dandridge Nelson and which amounts are to be paid by Am^m Martin and Dandridge Nelson without interest to James C. Martin and Slack & Nelson when the said legacies arrive at the age of 25 years.
- Item - I give and bequeath Matilda Stoner the sum of five hundred dollars and in case of her death said amount is to go to her daughter.
- Item - I give and bequeath the foregoing legacies upon the condition that they the legacies each pay one percent per annum of the amount each one receives out of their respective legacies for the support of the Ministry of the Methodist Church in the respective Communities in which they may live. And if any of the above named should refuse to comply with this provision they shall not receive nor have the sum given and bequeathed to them but shall forfeit the same.
- Item - I give and bequeath to the Trustees of Thrashers Chapel M. E. Church South the sum of five hundred dollars to be held in trust. The interest of which is to be applied semi annually to the support of the Ministry of Roanoke Circuit Methodist Episcopal Church South.
- Item - In case of an insufficiency to give the amounts specified to the several legacies in my will, I devise they shall share in a prorata proportion of said deficiency and in case of a surplus that said legacies shall share in a prorata proportion of the surplus.
- Item - I devise that the Trustees of Thrashers Chapel shall receive the five hundred dollars bequeathed for the support of the Ministry of the M. E. Church South, whether there be an insufficiency or not and to receive there prorata proportion of the Surplus should there be any.

And lastly I do nominate and appoint Smith Petty and William L. Williamson to be the Executors of this my last will and Testament.
