Item 2nd I give to my beloved wife Eliza Harvey all of my estate of every kind to be held used and enjoyed by her during her life and as it is my earnest desire to provide fully for her comfort I do hereby direct that she shall have the right and priv-

illegals to use any of said property principal as well as the proceeds and profits that she may think proper and necessary and is not to be accountable in any manner or to any person therefor

Item 3rd At the death of my beloved wife I give whatever of my estate that may be left and not used by her to my two daughters to wit, Henrietta Starkey wife of J. M. Starkey and Louisa Persinger wife of John Persinger in equal portions not charging either of them with any advancements made by me to them.

Item 4th I direct that there shall be no inventory or appraisement made of my estate.

Item 5th I hereby appoint my beloved wife Eliza Harvey Executrix of this my last will and testament and direct that she may be permitted to qualify as such without being required to give security.
