

the farm, I direct my executor to pay to my daughters, William Jopling, Catherine Oak, and Walter Magill the sum of one thousand dollars each, but provided the farm does not bring the sum of three thousand dollars, then the amount it does bring to be divided equally between them as their entire legacy. if the farm should bring over that amount, the remainder whatever it may be, I give to my son B. S. Barnett - and to my daughter in law Leslie S. Barnett, to be divided equally between them.

The piece of mountain land adjoining the farm of B. S. Barnett, I give to him in fee simple.

I hereby appoint my son B. S. Barnett my executor to carry out the above provisions of this, my last will and testament, given under my hand and seal this 19th day of October 1900.
