Samuel Showalter In the name of God Amen, I Samuel Showalter of the County of Roanoke and State of Va., knowing the brevity of life, and being of sound mind and disposing memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament.

1st I direct that my burial & funeral expenses be paid by my executors out of the first money that comes into his hands.

2nd I direct that all my just debts be paid off soon after my demise as may be convenient by my executors.

3rd I desire my wife Sarah shall retain her slaves in the home place during her natural life, after her death the said slaves to be sold and the proceeds divided equally between my children.

4th I direct that my executors as soon as convenient after my death to pay to Hannah Colingeful one hundred dollars for services.

5th I give and bequeath to my son Edward the House and lot at Hanging Rock that I ~~lot~~ of J. P. Landon containing Two & 1/2 acres

6th I give and bequeath to my son Edward my place on the ridge on the east side of Masons Creek adjoining the lands of W. C. Harris and Hannah Showalter & W. Gault and others supposed to contain Eighty acres more or less

7th I direct that my executors pay to my daughter Letitia Martin as soon after my death as convenient five hundred dollars this amount with the advancements made heretofore shall constitute her share of my estate.

8th I give and bequeath to my son Jacob an interest in the home place of Eight hundred dollars, this amount with advancements made before shall constitute his share of my estate

9th I direct my executors as soon as convenient after my death to sell my Catawba farm and to make the following distribution of the proceeds

1st pay to heirs of my Son Wm Showalter Two hundred a piece

2nd pay to my Son Henry Showalter five hundred dollars this being his part of my estate

3^d pay to my daughter Katie Ray five hundred dollars this being her part of my Estate

4th pay to Catharine Runk five hundred dollars this being her part of my Estate

5th pay to Elizabeth Anderson five hundred dollars this amount with advancements made heretofore constitute her part of my estate.

I hereby appoint my Son Jacob Showalter my Executor I direct my Executor after paying off paying out all the aforesaid bequests in this will, the residue after settling every thing and paying all expense whatever, shall be equally divided between my children or their heirs.

Second Part "Agreement"

Whereas there is a contention about the validity of the last will and testament of Samuel Showalter deceased, now pending in the County Court of Roanoke County on the motion to admit said will to probate, we the heirs at law of the said Samuel Showalter and legatees under said will in order to settle all matters concerned in said contract hereby agree in the manner following to: the said contest to be withdrawn and the will allowed to be recorded without objection, 2dly, the Executor shall pay out of the first proceeds of the estate the funeral expenses, all just debts against said estate including the sum of One hundred Dollars to Miss Hannah Colingwood for services rendered the said Samuel Showalter during his lifetime, 3dly: He shall pay to the heirs of the said Showalter, or their guardian whom appointed the sum of Four Hundred Dollars, being two hundred dollars to each of the said heirs, 4thly: Mrs. Sarah Showalter, the widow of the said Samuel Showalter is to have possession and enjoyment of the farm known as the "Home Place" during her natural life as above, after her death the same to be sold and the sum of eight hundred dollars to be first paid out of the proceeds of sale to Edward Showalter and the residue to be equally divided among the heirs at law of the said Samuel Showalter, including the said Edward, all the residue of the estate of the said Showalter to be sold by said Executor and the proceeds of the sale to be equally divided among the heirs of the said Samuel Showalter, excepting the said Edward Showalter, the said sum of four hundred dollars to be deducted from any share that may be going to the heirs of Wm. Showalter, it being the intention of this agreement that the said heirs shall have at least \$400.00, and shall have no more unless from the sale of the share of the other heirs exceed

\$400.00 when they, the heirs of the said com Shewalter shall share in any such exec^u.

The said Edward Showalter to execute and deliver deeds to the purchasers of the tracts of land bequeathed to him in said will.
