14 Lewis Burnell two hundred & fifty dollars, to be
15 paid to him as the foregoing sum is paid to Henry -
16 2nd I direct that my two old servants Edmund
17 Rideout & Nannie, his wife, shall be comfortably
18 maintained & cared for out of my Estate
19 during their lives & shall be decently buried -
20 This I have no doubt my son would do of
21 his own accord, but others might not, in the
22 event of his death - My other servants are able to provide
23 & appoint my two Brothers in Law, Judge William
24 J. Robertson & Dr Francis Sorrell, my Executors
25 & also the Guardians of my son, Jno. Allen Watts
26 & direct that no security shall be required of them
27 by the Court, in either capacity or Trust, my Estate
28 being ample for the payment of all my Debts -


