tenement I now live on to be equal divisions in the same
to them there heirs and assigns forever I also give to my
daughter Peninnah to her heirs forever I also give and be-
queath to my two daughters above named all and singular my
movable estate over and debts to be divided equally to them.

that my two sons William & Thomas Taylor together with

my daughter Martha be paid three Spanish milled dollars

last will and testament. I do also revoke and relinquish all

other wills and Testaments made heretofore and pronounce

court by Thomas Lackey Executor therein named and proved
by the Oaths of Joseph Tate and Henry Brattle subscribing
witnesses and ordered to be Recorded And on the motion
of said Executor who made oath according to Law Certificate
is granted him for obtaining probate thereof in due ^{form} and
giving security. and he together with James Poston his
co-surety entered into and acknowledged bond in the penalty
of \$2000 conditioned according to Law
