Matthew the third of my land with the profits arising from the same  
During her natural life I like bequeath unto my said beloved wife during  
her natural life the Negroe mench named Nancy liberating the third of my  
Stock and the whole of the house hold and kitchen furniture to be at her  
disposal.

part of my Land (after the above bequeathed unto my wife). with the  
profits arising from the same together with my Negroe fellow manured  
Balee and the stock now before bequeathed my plantation and farmings  
utencils, to be Continued for the Term of Twelve years from my Decrees  
under the direction of my wife aided by the advise and Counsel of my  
other Executors for the purpose of supporting and instructing my  
children in a decent and Christian like manner and Peasoyg the  
young slaves belonging to my estate

Item. it is my will and I bequeath unto my four sons Alexander,  
John, James, Joseph and William them their Heir and assigns  
for ever the plantation that I now live on containing four hundred  
acres to be equally divided between them that is each to have an

Item it is my will and I bequeath unto my four sons Alex-  
ander, John, James, Joseph and William them their heirs and assign-

hundred acres on said plantation and the value of their slaves

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to said land shall not interfere with it During the term of the  
twelve years before mentioned, if any, said cows should die before  
they come to the age of twenty one years and without lawfull  
~~Issue~~, from them part in said land shall be equally divided  
amongst their surviving brothers.

- Item I will also bequeath unto my three Daughters Jemmy,  
Nelly & Belasye a young heifer to each, also a Decent Horse and  
double bed of furniture, as also as for Cows house & kitchen furniture  
I shall leave it to the discretion of my executors to furnish each of them.

It is likewise my will and bequeath unto each of my said three  
Daughters the sum of three hundred Dollars to be paid them by my  
five sons each of said Sons paying an equal part which I consider  
them intitled to in lieu of their not having a part in my land

for which sum of three hundred Dollars to each I consider the Estates  
of my survivable, and reavents my executors to use the
