tors ~~and~~ and as touching the worldly goods of which I am possessed I give order
and dispose in form and manner following - And first I will that all my
Just Debts be Paid - Item I give will and bequeath to my well beloved
wife Rachel Jamison the one third of all my moveable estate after my
debts are paid also her living and to be decently supported off the Plantation

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as long as she lives my Negro woman Ballow to be sold and her price consid-
ered as part of my moveable estate - Item I give will and bequeath
to my three sons John William & Robert the Plantation I now
live

on to be equally divided between them - Here I give and bequeath to my
daughter Peggy Armstrong fifteen Shillings - ^{Here} I give to my son Robert fifteen shil-
lings of my moveable estate Here I give will and bequeath to my daughter Phoebe La-

maison one third of the whole moveable estate after my wife has got her thirds and my

and my debts paid the remaining part of my moveable estate I allow to be equally divi-

ded between my two sons John Larison and Wm Larison To nominate and ^{appoint} John

Dunlap my son John Larison and William Larison Executors of this my last

will and testament
