In the name of God amen this eleventh day of
November in the year of our lord one thousand seven hundred and
ninety seven I Alexander M^c Corkery of Rockbridge and state
of Virginia being of sound mind & memory calling to mind
the mortality of my body do make ordain ^{and} constitute this my
last ^{will} and Testament in the first place I will that all debts due
me by others be collected & and those due by me be paid

Item I will and bequeath unto James M^c Corkery my brother
Samuels son and John M^c Corkery my brother David son each
the sum of fifty pounds to them their heirs &c. Item I will
and bequeath unto John M^c Corkery Samuels son the sum of twenty
pounds Alexander M^c Corkery Samuels son fifteen pounds and
Elijah Samuels son the sum of ten pound to them their heirs
&c. And I bequeath the sum of five pounds unto William M^c
Corkery Samuels son his heirs. Item I bequeath unto Elizabeth
M^c Corkery Samuels daughter the sum of fifteen pounds

and bequeeth unto John M'Coskey Samuels Son the sum of twenty
Pounds Alexander M'Coskey Samuels Son fifteen Pounds and
Elijah Samuels Son the sum of ten Pound to them their heirs
&c. And I bequeeth the sum of five pounds unto William M'
Coskey Samuels son his heirs. Then I bequeeth unto Elizabeth
M'Coskey Samuels daughter the sum of fifteen Pounds and
I bequeeth unto Esther Walker Samuel M'Coskey daughter the
sum of six Pounds. Then it is my Will and I bequeeth
unto Mary M'Coskey Sun M'Coskey and Esther M'Coskey
daughters of my brother David each of them the sum of twenty
Pounds to them their heirs &c. and the sum of five pounds unto
Jean Bedford David M'Coskey daughter. Then I bequeeth unto
Mary Bedford James Bedfords daughter the sum of fifteen pounds
and the sum of eight pounds unto David Bedford James Bedford
son. Then I bequeeth unto Mary M'Coskey David daughter

the sum of eight pounds. And I bequeath unto my brother Samuel
 M'Coskrey the sum of fifteen pounds and seven shillings is all that
 I bequeath unto my brother John M'Coskrey. Item I will and bequeath
 unto Polly Sedford Jemmy Sedford Esther Sedford daughters of James
 Sedford the sum of four pounds each and it is my will and I order
 that the remainder of my estate be equally divided between the
 children of my brother Samuel M'Coskrey and the children of my brother
 David M'Coskrey Dec^d I am in full is and I do hereby appoint Con-
 stitute and ordain William Buchanan Jemmy Sutton and John
 Walker sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament and do hereby
 revoke and disannul all other wills and testaments by me heretofore

This Writing purporting the last will & testament
of Alexander McCroskey Deceased - was produced in Court by James
Cutton & John Walker two of the Executors herein named and
was proved by John Stuart and Alexander Walker two of the subscrib-
ing Witnesses ^{here to} and was ordered to be Recorded. The said Executors
refused to undertake the beathen heretofore and William Buchanan an

other Executor herein mentioned having certified his refusal. An motion
of James Telford & John McCroskey who made oath according
Law Certificate is granted them for obtaining letters of Administra-
tion with the Will annexed of D. decedant's estate. and they
with Joseph Allen & Nicholas Spring their securities entered into
a acknowledged bond in the sum of \$5000 Conditioned according
to Law.
