allow to be divided Equally to each daughter and what cloaths I may

Elihu Barclay dead to whom I have conveyed by deed of Gift the

James Moore the Executors therein named and proved by the oath of
James Moore and Isaac Paxton two of the subscribing witnesses thereto
and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of said Executors
who annexed according to law certificate is granted them for obtaining
probate thereof in due form they having together with Hugh
Paxton & James Moore and their securities returned into and acknowledged
before the court in the sum of three thousand dollars conditional according
to law
