

At Rockbridge County Court June 5th 1813

A writing purporting the last will and Testament of John Mc Campbell deceased was produced in Court by Amos Pridgen the Executor therein named and proved by the oath of Thomas L. Preston & Edward Graham to be the proper hand writing of said Decedent, there being no subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded - And on the motion of Mary Mc Campbell widow and relict of the said Decedent and Samuel Mc D. Rice letters of administration ~~and~~ with the said will annexed and granted them in due form on the Estate of the said Decedent the said Executor having refused to take upon

Samuel W. D. New letters of administration ~~and~~
with the said will annexed are granted them
in due form on the Estate of the said Decedent
the said Executor having refused to take upon
himself the burden of the Execution thereof
And thereupon the said Administrator and
Administrator made oath according to Law
and together with said Andrew Newell their
Security entered into and acknowledged Bonds
in the penalty of \$2000 conditioned according
to Law - Wherefore the Administration heretofore
granted before the Discovery of the said Will is set
aside and annulled.
