against me by the Heirs of Benjamin Borden for my lands

if said suit should not succeed me said suit I will and bequeath

to said Agnes Evans the sum of twenty pounds more after

said suit is determined to be paid in money if convenient other

wise in horse flesh about which if the parties cannot agree

the value to be ascertained by disinterested persons chosen by the
parties whose Judgment shall be final. But if said land
then she shall not receive any thing more than the fifty
above mentioned which Fifty I allow in discharge of any
and every Evans may have against my Estate as ~~administer~~
of the Estate of her Father.

I also have one request to my Justice John Atterbury
William Atterbury my Brother who has been my chief
support in my declining age. I wish and beg that all
land &c the remainder of my estate both Real and personal
to him and his heirs forever.

In the last place I do hereby constitute and appoint the above
mentioned John Atterbury Esq. my Executor, the sole Executor

my last Will and Testament and do hereby revoke all former
Wills and bequestments by my heretofore made, and declare this to be
my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal this thirtieth day of April in

~~the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and nine~~
