following manner, it is my will and I order that my funeral charges be
paid & what debts is due to me be collected by my ~~Executor~~ and
whereas the Administrators of the estate of James Walker deceased have
entered into an obligation to give a certain degree of liberty unto the
old negroe woman named Lurey in order to increp the said liberty or
procure as great a degree of freedom as will be for the benefit of the said
Lurey I order and it is my will that thirty pounds of my cash be
applied by my ~~Executor~~ for that purpose or as much of it as they
may think necessary and as I am intitled to a proportion of the
inculcator Time time during my natural life, I consider what I have
received and what I shall receive a full satisfaction for said proportion
of said Time time so that there shall be no demand made upon
Wugh Bellis for said time that was my due. It is in
my Will and I order that all the rest of my estate including

Wash. cloth. beds & furniture household & kitchen furniture
cattle &c. be equally divided between my three daughters Mary
Felsa Jean Moore & Elizabeth Stuart and it is my will that it
be intended for their own use and solely at their own disposal.

And if any part of the before mentioned thirty pounds that
is appropriated for obtaining as great a degree of freedom as will
be for the benefit of the old negro woman named Lurey shall
remain it is my Will that said remainder be equally divided
between my three daughters as above.

I constitute and
appoint Hugh Felsa and John Stuart my son in Law execs.
Execution of this my last will and Testament. In Witness

day of May one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven
