of my Body that it is appointed unto all men once to die, do
make & ordain this my will and Testament in assurance will
form following, that is to say Principally & first of all I give
& convey my soul unto the hands of God who gave it and my

Body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner at the
discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but I shall receive the

same at the general resurrection by the mighty power of God unto
touching such things of my Estate as it hath pleased God to bless
with in this life I will & bequeath as followeth,

First I will that all my just debts and funeral Expenses be leg-
ally discharged

also to my son William
Cummingsham I leave the plantation I now live in containing

Hogs & Sheep and all the implements of husbandry and furniture in the house & Kitchen The paying the Legacies Hereafter mentioned to my Three Daughters who are to have their maintenance on said place untill they are married or otherway provided for. also to my son William my Negro man Jerry with the choice land to him and his heirs forever, also to my Daughter Isabella Cunningham I leave my Negro Girl Mowah and fifteen pounds in money And a horse and saddle at least worth twenty five pounds with a bed and furniture & a cow all to be paid to her by my son William within one year after she comes of age or is married, also I will to my Daughter Isabella Cunningham my Negro Boy Sam with fifteen pounds in money a horse & saddle at least worth twenty five pounds with a bed & furniture & a cow all to be paid by my son William within one year after she comes of age or is married,

also I give unto my daughter Betsy Cunningham my negro
girl Rachel with fifteen pounds in money and a horse and
saddle worth at least twenty five pounds with a bed and fur-
-niture & how all which is to be paid by my son William within
one year after she is of age or married,

and I do constitute & appoint John Rockpaterck & my son
William Cunningham Executors of this my last will and testa-
ment and I do hereby utterly disannul and revoke all other wills
Legacies or Bequeathments by me willed or Bequeathed, in witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty
Eighth day of July one Thousand Eight hundred and six.

The last will & Testament of Thomas Cunningham dec^d was produced in court By John Ruckpattick & W^m Cunningham the Exors therein named and proved by the oaths of Edward Carson & John Willson two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded, and on the motion of the said Exors who made oath according to law certificate is granted them for obtaining probate thereof in due form they having together with John Patton & John Carson their securities entered into and acknowledged on bond in the penalty of \$1000 conditioned according to law
