

Wm. Miller's Deed in the name of god amano October 22nd 1808 I William
Miller

Exam^d Miller of Rockbridge County and State of Virginia being
weak and infirm in body but of good and perfect mind and
memory and calling to mind the mortality of the body and
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make
known
this my last Will and Testament.

Primely and fully I give and recommend my soul into
hands of god who give it and as for my body I recommend it to
earth to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion
of my Executors hereafter mentioned nothing doubting

that the same will be done by the

mighty power of god and as rendering mysteriously effects in the
heavly pleased god to bestow me I give Bequeath and dispose of the
same in manner and form following

I then leave to my wife Abigail the present house and Lot wherein
she now live lying on the name Street of Lexington with all the
movables presently thereto belonging except so much as shall be
thought necessary to put my daughter Abigail on unequal footing
with the rest of my children which is now named the same to
hold free of any molestation whatever during her widowhood or until

my son William Kells comes of age and then if living & Widow is to
have any apartment of said House and Lot she shall think proper
to live in during life - I then leave and bequeath to my son William
Kells my right Title and interest of s^d House and Lot to my s^d son
William Kells and all the accoutrements thereto belonging to be

William Thellier and all the appertinances thereto belonging for and
in consideration of him complying with the following terms to-wit:

Heave to my daughter Polly Langhlin at her years twenty five pounds
payable in one year after my son William Thellier comes of age also

in like manner twenty five pounds to my daughter Betty Young at

her years to be paid in two years after ~~Penny~~ of age also twenty five pounds

to my youngest daughter Abigail to be paid her in three years after my

son William comes to the age of twenty one which I now is to pay

in the same due without Interest as above mentioned also it is my con-

sent that my Executors shall be perticuled in saying that my R

son shall have his mother with due respect and all the effects that

my wife shall ^{have} possess of at her death shall return to my son

son William Thellier

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And I do hereby constitute and appoint Hugh Laughlin and John Sloan Executors of this my last Will and Testament, revoking and annulling all other former Will or Wills heretofore by me made, ratifying and confirming this to be my last Will & Testament.
