it may be decent ~~without~~ ^{without} pomp or state at the discretion of my
dear wife and Executors herein after named. As to my worldly
estate I will and positively order that all my debts be paid first.
I give my wife the House I now live in for the term of her life with
all the furniture and at her death to be disposed of as she
pleases to the heirs after named with the stock now in my
possession one horse one cow and two sheep excepted with the
rents arising from the land during John Mayers time
for the payment of clothing and schooling my son Wm. I
Relieve the said son and in lieu of his money these things

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above named to be disposed of by my Executors after named for the purposes before mentioned. To my daughter Mary I leave the sum of one dollar to my ^{daughter} ~~son~~ I leave or give the sum of five pounds at the expiration of four years. To my daughter Ephabellia one horse one Cow and two Sheep the Horses to be of twenty pounds value and after five years from the date to receive five pounds per year for the term of four years. To my sons William and Robert I leave my plantation to be equally divided between them at the expiration of nine years.

I do constitute and appoint Robert M^cCalpin and John M. Walker my Executors of this my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fifth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two and on twenty sixth year of American Independence.

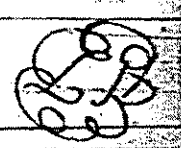
