 constitute and authorize my faithful beloved ^{wife} ~~eldest~~ daughter
 and my truly beloved son Joseph Porter my Executors
 & Executors to see that my last Will & Testament in all
 its parts fulfilled and executed, and I hereby revoke
 all other last Wills & Testaments heretofore made by
 me and in presence of the witnesses is hereunto subscribing
